Disclaimer: Bear in mind that the statute of limitations for filing for a reward may be as short as three years for many types of tax evasion and six years for other types, and that your ability to claim a reward may be cut off earlier if someone else publicizes the conduct at issue, if someone else files before you, or if the government is otherwise spurred into action.
